Upcoming works for the Monterey Recycled Water Scheme in May 2025

We're expanding our recycled water network to keep your favourite green spaces thriving, and save our drinking water for where it's really needed.

The Monterey Recycled Water Scheme (RWS) will see the construction of 2.3km of new pipeline to deliver Class A recycled water to 4 sites in Frankston North, including Eric Bell Reserve, Monterey Soccer Fields, Pat Rollo Reserve and The National Golf Course - Long Island.

The scheme aims to deliver 98 ML of recycled water each year. The high-quality recycled water for the scheme will come from Melbourne Water's Eastern Treatment Plant.

By supplying recycled water to local sporting grounds and a world class golf course, the scheme will help preserve drinking water supply, regardless of changing climate conditions. The project will cost approximately \$4 million of which the Victorian Government has committed \$1,332,500. The rest will be funded by South East Water and customers of the scheme.

The construction of the Monterey RWS network has been awarded to our Industry Partner Abergeldie, BMD & KBR Joint Venture (ABK).

Key facts



We're installing 2.3kms of new pipeline to deliver Class A recycled water to 4 sites.



We estimate the scheme to save up to 98 megalitres of drinking water every year. That's 98 million litres and could fill the Pines Forest pool about 50 times!



We expect to finish construction by November 2025 with recylced water available for use in late 2025.



What to expect during these works

The pipeline will begin at The Pines Flora and Fauna Reserve, and continue along Silver Avenue, Moreton Street, Monterey Boulevard, Lehman Crescent, Forest Drive and Messamate Street. Finishing at the National Gold Club - Long Island. See map above.

Most of the construction will be trenchless, with majority of the works being in the road reserve.

We'll do our best to keep impacts to a minimum, however these are the kinds of things you might notice while we work:

- More trucks on the streets around you.
- Fewer car parks around the work zones.
- Noise from machinery, like beepers when trucks reverse.

- Intermittent lane closures along the alignment.
- Reduced speed limits will be in place.

Our traffic management team will be around to make sure people, bikes and cars can move around safely.

During construction ABK will have a site compound set up at the Monterey Community Park overflow carpark on Lehmann Crescent.

You shouldn't notice any change to your water or sewer services while we work.

When we've finished the job, we'll leave things how we found them and make sure we return any areas we've impacted as close as possible to their original condition.
